Despite Hard Times MSI Mechanical Gives Back to the Community

Manchester, NH – This past year has been incredibly uncertain for many companies, and budgets have been tightened in order to stay in business. But in these tough times, MSI Mechanical Systems of Salem, NH, recognizes the great need in their community and decided to take action. Vice President Brian Hooper presented the New Hampshire Food Bank with a \$1,000 donation.

“MSI wants to give back to the community and help the people in the community that need it the most,” says Hooper. “We can’t make a difference if we don’t make the effort, and the New Hampshire Food Bank is a perfect example of ‘if you give, we can make a difference.’”

MSI’s donation will support the 1st Annual New Hampshire Food Bank Golf Classic, which will take place on July 27th. This will be the first golf tournament hosted by the Food Bank, and proceeds will help to address the increase of need in our state through the summer months. During the school year, 44,880 children in New Hampshire receive meals through free or reduced priced school lunch programs. When school breaks for the summer, less than 14% of those children will continue to receive those meals from state-run programs. The impact on the families of the other 86% is devastating, and many of those children go hungry. Food pantries and soup kitchens look to the Food Bank for extra food so that the children will receive the meals they need to maintain healthy minds and bodies.
